Award Application/Nomination Form

The following guidelines have been prepared to assist in the selection of the awardees:

Purpose -

To recognize those students who:

- have excelled throughout their undergraduate experience (within and outside the classroom) in the areas of academics, service, and influence
- can articulate how their experiences and accomplishments have prepared them to enter their profession and become a contributing member to meet ever-changing professional challenges and societal needs
- have demonstrated growth, as students and future professionals, through accomplishments made within their department, college, university, community, and future profession

Eligibility -

Any undergraduate student in the College of Food, Agricultural, and Environmental Sciences and the School of Environment and Natural Resources who will graduate during the **calendar year of 2018 with a bachelor's degree** is eligible for consideration. A student may apply only once for this award.

Selection Criteria -

Applicants must have a 3.00 cumulative GPA at the time of application. Accomplishments and the ability to communicate the results and impacts from their individual experiences in the areas of **academics**, **service**, and **influence** will serve as the primary evaluation factors for the selection of award recipients.

Application Deadline -

Applicants must complete and submit their nomination form on or before Monday, January 22, 2018 to Ms. Katie Share (share.9@osu.edu). The email date "received" time stamp will be used as verification of meeting the deadline.

Interviews -

Applications will be reviewed and screened by the Selection Committee and a selected group of students will be scheduled for an interview to be held in February. The final selection will be based on the information provided in the application (80%) and the interview (20%). Announcement of recipients will be made shortly after interviews are completed.

Presentation of Award -

Awards will be presented during the College's 2018 Outstanding Senior Student Recognition program to be conducted in late March, early April 2018.

Selection Committee -

The Selection Committee will be comprised of a faculty representative from each academic unit within CFAES.

- 2. A copy of your up-to-date resume (1-2 pages)
- 3. A copy of your current advising report

When completing the application form:

- 1. Make note of and adhere to the character limit (which includes spaces) for each section (if exceeded, that information will not be visible to the selection committee)
- 2. Include ONLY information related to your undergraduate career (Do NOT include information from high school) transfer/transitioning students make certain to include information from your previous collegiate institution(s)
- Should you have more examples than the space provided for any given section, list your strongest examples in the listing portion of the application but make certain to include other meaningful, consequential, or salient experiences in your narrative entry

Print a copy of your completed application form, for your records, prior to submission **IMPORTANT**:

- 1.) Save this application form to your computer before starting to complete.
- 2.) After saving the document on your computer, open that copy of the document file.
- 3.) Complete the form. You MUST use Adobe Reader when completing this form (Apple users: DO NOT use "Preview" for completing this form for submission). Remember to save a copy of your completed form for your records.
- 4.) Attach a copy of your completed and saved application packet to an email to share.9@osu.edu.




