



The Department of Animal Sciences at Colorado State University is seeking a Master's Graduate Assistant starting in Summer 2020 in the area of dairy calf health, behavior, and management. The student will be advised by Dr. Catie Cramer.

The MS program will include both research and teaching. A portion of the MS funding is a teaching assistantship and requires a strong interest in and dedication to undergraduate teaching.

Qualifications

Applicants must have earned a B.S. in Animal or Dairy Science or a similar field with a minimum of a 3.0 GPA. The ideal candidate must have a strong work ethic, be able to work independently and in a group setting, have excellent written and oral communication skills, and have a positive and enthusiastic attitude. Experience with livestock research and undergraduate teaching is preferred, but not required.

Compensation

Students will be paid at the departmental base rate. Support for tuition, fees, and graduate student health insurance will be evaluated annually based upon satisfactory progress towards degree completion.
